What's New?

A \$22 million 111,000 square foot free-standing facility adjacent to the well-known Chesterwood Village in West Chester with 74 private luxury suites for post-hospital patients requiring rehabilitation in order to return home. Another 51 suites are designated for long-term care nursing at the opposite end of the building. The rehab equipment is the most progressive in the Tri-State, using virtual reality and new ergonomic designs.

Why Is It Technologically Advanced?

The facility is equipped with modern HUR equipment, versatile for inpatient/outpatient care as well as wellness. Everything is ergonomically designed for strengthening in order to minimize potential for joint wear and tear, while maximizing physical benefits from exercising. The facility is also introducing rehab using the latest virtual reality. Some examples:

- Cyber cycles promote general strengthening. Research shows their use also slows dementia/cognition decline.
- C-Mill is great for inpatient and outpatient use with its weight lift design for lower functioning patients and balance training using a virtual reality projector for fall prevention. Virtual reality also helps delay cognition decline in aging residents.
- Bio Steps are designed for strengthening and cardiovascular endurance in inpatient, outpatient and wellness settings
- The Biodex machine and gait trainer measure the probability of falls and prevent them from happening
- The Keiser leg press, hamstring curl, chest press, knee extension machines and others use the latest technology to strengthen all parts of the body

 - Armeo Spring and Senso for inpatient and outpatient neurological and upper extremity orthopedic patients
 - Biosteps to strengthen cardiovascular endurance for inpatient, outpatient and wellness
 - Muvi and FES strengthening equipment for the wheelchair-bound and patients experiencing conditions such as MS. It electrically stimulates targeted muscles. It's ideal for inpatient, outpatient and wellness.
